

Sandbach School Ethos

The School Day

Getting to School

Students may choose to use bicycles to travel to school. They should use the Middlewich Road entrance and facilities are available for secure storage.

Breakfast / Break / Lunch

Boys in Years 7-11 are not allowed out of school at breaktime or lunchtime. The Refectory is available for boys to purchase a range of snacks / hot meals and drinks at both breaktime and lunchtime. It is also open for breakfast from 8am. Upon entry to the school the refectory team will take a scan of your son's fingertip so that he is able to use the cashless catering system. A cash loading machine is available for students to load cash onto their account. Alternatively parents can use the parent pay website to upload payments and set limits. A unique username and password will be issued to parents upon your son's entry to the school.

Students may prefer to bring packed lunches into school and provision is made for them to eat these within the refectory.

Social spaces are allocated to each key stage and students may also take up the opportunity of using the LRC, Homework Club, Games Club or any other of the clubs advertised in the daily bulletin.

Attendance / Absence

A great deal of emphasis is placed on the importance of attendance. In the event of illness parents should telephone Main Reception on 01270 758870 explaining the reasons for absence. Parents should notify school each day of absence. If this is not possible your son must bring a note explaining the absence and hand this in to his form tutor on the first day of return.

If your son is unwell or injured during the school day he should go to the year group office where a member of staff can deal with the issue.

Correct school uniform must be worn at all times. If for some reason your son cannot wear the correct uniform, you should send a note with your son explaining the circumstances. He may then be issued with loaned items (including shoes). Additional information regarding uniform can be found below. Please pay special attention to the information regarding haircuts.

Additional information

- Jewellery, other than a wrist watch, may not be worn.
- No piercings, including earrings are allowed.
- No makeup or nail varnish.
- No excessive number or inappropriate badges.
- Trainers are not allowed unless accompanied by medical authorisation.
- Hair must be of natural looking colour with no extreme styles.
- Hair which has been dyed or streaked with unnatural colours or unnatural combinations is not acceptable.
- Hair in which lines and/or shapes are cut into the hair is not acceptable.
- Extreme contrasts in length of hair are also not acceptable; for example, very short shaved hair overlaid with longer hair.
- Coats or jackets may be worn on top of blazer around the school site but must be taken off when entering classrooms. Hoodies or tracksuit tops may not be worn in place of a coat.

Students are expected to be PREPPED at all times. This stands for pen, ruler, eraser, pencil and protractor every day. A scientific calculator is also recommended for all lessons during their school week. This aspect will be checked daily by their Form Tutor and Subject Tutors.

Home Learning

At Sandbach School we use an electronic homework package called Show My Homework (SMHW). This package ensures that home learning is set effectively, allowing our students to easily stay organised, consistently meet home learning deadlines and have access to their requested tasks anywhere via their electronic devices. From a parental perspective, this system will allow you to take an active role in your son's home learning as attainment can be tracked and monitored using the SMHW system.

Your son will receive a home learning timetable at the beginning of the academic year. Staff will set home learning according to the home learning timetable. Failure to complete home learning will result in department sanctions which may include detentions.

School Closure

In the unlikely event of needing to close the school, due to heavy snowfall or some other unforeseen occurrence, parents will be contacted via text message in the first instance. It will be announced on both Radio Stoke and Signal Radio. The school website and social media pages will also have up to date information regarding the closure.

School Facilities

LRC

The Learning Resource Centre is open from 8am each morning and closes at 4.30pm (4.00pm Fridays). Students are expected to adhere to the loaning arrangements.

ICT Facilities

Students will use a range of ICT facilities whilst at Sandbach School. All students are asked to sign the school's acceptable user policy and adhere to its guidelines. Serious mis-use of ICT facilities is dealt with by a member of the Leadership Group.

Music Lessons

A range of peripatetic music lessons are available to students at a cost. Information about these is distributed during the transition process by the Curriculum Leader for Music.

Behaviour & Discipline

Ready, Respectful, Safe

Pupil behaviour and progress can often go hand in hand. We have a minimum expectation of how students should conduct themselves both within lessons and across the school site and expect all students to follow 3 key rules: Ready, Respectful and Safe.

During every lesson your son will receive an Attitude to Learning grade by his subject teacher. This grade is on a scale of 1-5, 1 being an exemplary attitude to learning and 5 being an attitude to learning which impedes progress. The Attitude to Learning grades, positive or negative, will be acted upon by departments and be monitored by the pastoral team.

Sanctions

Sanctions will be applied for failing to follow school rules. These may be in the form of lunchtime or after school detentions within departments. An escalation of issues may result in a whole school detention, an internal exclusion or Headteacher's exclusion.

Mobile Phones

The current mobile phone policy is displayed on the school website and will be explained to your son upon entry to the school.

Pupil Support

Pastoral Team

Your son will have a form tutor who he should use as a first point of reference should he have a problem. The year group is overseen by a Learning & Intervention Manager and a Student Support Co-ordinator. These individuals will monitor your son's academic and social progress and inform you of any concerns. You may wish to speak to a member of the pastoral team and you can do so by calling school on 01270 758870. As well as organising academic intervention they also have access to a range of professionals both inside and outside of school to support your son. These include the school nurse and school counsellor.

Bullying

Incidents of bullying at Sandbach School are taken very seriously. If your son considers that he is being bullied he should inform his form tutor, Learning & Intervention Manager or Student Support Co-ordinator immediately. This will enable the issue to be dealt with appropriately. There is also a supportive provision supervised by some of our 6th Form students to allow students to discuss any issues regarding bullying. The 6th Form students will report any concerns to the pastoral teams on behalf of the younger students.

House System

Upon entry to the school your son will be placed into one of four Houses (Lea, Craig, Ward or Welles). This will determine the colour of the crests on his tie. Across the course of the year there are a number of House events in which boys can compete. The House system culminates in Sports Day which takes place in July after which the House Championship is awarded.

Other Activities

There are numerous other activities available for your son to take advantage of. There is an extracurricular booklet (Xtra) produced every term which outlines the activities available, the days and the times which they take place on. A copy of this can be downloaded from the school's website.

Communication

Review & Commendations

There are 3 Review periods across the course of the academic year. Your son will receive a Review sheet which indicates the current progress in each of his subject areas. Assessments will take place prior to each of the reviews and these will be fundamental in assessing student progress. In addition to this level/grade he will also receive an "attitude to learning" grade. This grade will translate into a number of commendations. Commendations are also awarded by form tutors, for extra-curricular involvement, for taking part in House events and other school commitments. Commendations are collected across the year and certificates are awarded for reaching certain thresholds. Commendations are also accumulated across key stages and can result in the awarding of school colours. The system of commendations will be explained to your son by his form tutor.

Parent Consultation Evenings

There will be a transition report which is sent home in the first half term. You are also invited to attend a Consultation Evening appointment with your son's subject teachers. This will take place over one evening per year group and involves a 5 minute discussion about your son's progress with up to 6 subject teachers.

Information Evenings & Forums

These are designed to give parents key information at important points in your son's school career. Information evenings for all year groups take place in September and will be publicised well in advance via the school website and social media. There are also regular Year group parental forums throughout the school year to discuss aspects pertinent to each year group.

Commemoration Day

Each year the school commemorates its founding in the Autumn Term. All year 7 students will attend the service at St Mary's Church in Sandbach and parents of all year 7 students are welcome to attend. The timings of the school day remain unchanged and further details will be sent out nearer the time.

Awards Day

This is an invite only event to celebrate the achievements of many of our pupils and takes place in early July.
