Building on prior knowledge and strengthening the appreciation of different worldviews whilst having a meaningful impact on cultural capital.

Why Religion in the Uk & Worldviews? Introducing students to the key fundamentals of good academic RS. Students will also gain insight into the religious makeup of the UK and understand that religious diversity is not a new oncept. This unit allows students to identify and recognise the interconnectedness and similarities in the Abrahamic Faiths rather than thinking that religions exist in a void. It helps students to understand the narrative and history of the Abrahamic faiths which in turn allows them to break down any prejudices or misconceptions.
